1 FAM 031 DEPUTY SECRETARY OF STATE (D)

(TL:ORG-62; 01-31-1995)

- a. Serves as the principal deputy and alter ego to the Secretary, and as Acting Secretary of State in the Secretary's absence.
- b. Serves as principal adviser to the Secretary and assists the Secretary in the formulation and conduct of all U.S. foreign policy.
- c. Assists the Secretary in giving overall supervision and direction to all substantive and administrative elements of the Department. Is responsible for the management of the Department's planning, evaluation, and resource allocation processes.
- d. Assists the Secretary in carrying out the Secretary's authority and responsibility for the overall direction, coordination, and supervision, of interdepartmental activities of the U.S. Government abroad.
- e. Assists the Secretary in directing the Department's participation in the National Security Council (NSC) system.
- f. Assists the Secretary in representing the United States at international meetings, in performing other representational assignments, and in presenting the Department's position before congressional committees.
- g. Provides final recommendations to the Secretary on important personnel appointments.
- h. Has substantive and coordinating responsibility for 1 FAM 030 —Office of the Deputy Secretary of State (D).

1 FAM 032 Authorities

(TL:ORG-62; 01-31-1995)

- a. In many cases, the Deputy Secretary has been authorized to exercise delegated authorities as well as those to whom specifically delegated. In addition to the State Department delegations listed in the following paragraphs, residual reserved authority goes to the Deputy Secretary (and the Secretary) for these specific Department delegations: 145, 146, 148, 193, 198, 210, 212, and 214.
- b. Department of State Delegation of Authority Number 133—National Gallery of Art restoration functions.
- c. Department of State Delegation of Authority Number 134—surrender of extradited fugitives.
- d. Department of State Delegation of Authority Number 144—approval of non-managerial qualifications of SES candidates.
- e. Department of State Delegation of Authority Number 140—nuclear non-proliferation functions.
- f. Department of State Delegation of Authority Number 193—certain functions under the FY 92-93 State Authorization Act.
- g. Department of State Delegation of Authority Number 202—transfer of forfeited foreign government assets.
- h. Department of State Delegation of Authority Number 205—negotiation and conclusion of international agreements.

1 FAM 033 DIRECTOR OF U.S. FOREIGN ASSISTANCE (F)

1 FAM 033.1 Responsibilities

(CT:ORG-197; 10-07-2008)

The Director of U.S. Foreign Assistance (F):

- (1) Serves as Director of U.S. Foreign Assistance while serving concurrently as the USAID Administrator. Reports directly to the Secretary of State (S) and *serves as a level equivalent to* the

Deputy Secretary of State;

- (2) Develops a coordinated U. S. Government foreign assistance strategy, including developing country specific assistance strategies and annual country-specific assistance operational plans as well as F goals and priorities;
- (3) Creates and directs consolidated policy, strategic and program plans, the operational budget, implementation mechanisms, and staff functions required to provide umbrella leadership to foreign assistance;
- (4) Has authority over all Department of State and USAID foreign assistance funding and programs, with continued participation in program planning, implementation, budget, oversight, and program results reporting from the various bureaus and offices within State and USAID, as part of the integrated interagency planning, coordination and implementation mechanisms;
- (5) Provides coordination, guidance, and assistance to all development assistance delivered through the Millennium Challenge Corporation and the Office of the Global AIDS Coordinator as well as implement a mechanism to effectively facilitate interagency collaboration of foreign assistance programs and policies of other agencies and entities of the U.S. Government;
- (6) Directs the required transformation of the U. S. Government approach to foreign assistance in order to achieve the President's Transformational Development Goals, and provides high-level comprehensive framework for reporting on achievements and summary of performance results that support the organization's strategic objectives;
- (7) *Assists the Secretary in directing U.S. foreign assistance; and*
- (8) *Has substantive and coordinating responsibility for 1 FAM.*

1 FAM 033.2 Authorities

- (2) *Arms Export Control Act;*
