## **2 FAM 462 REGIONAL BUREAUS AND THEIR SYMBOLS**

- (6) (APP) American Presence Post is a special-purpose post with limited staffing and responsibilities (see 2 FAM 111.2); and
- (7) Mission (M) is any Foreign Service post designated as an embassy or a legation and maintained to conduct normal continuing diplomatic relations between the Government of the United States and other governments.
