### **15 FAM 151 REASONS FOR INSPECTIONS**

*(CT:OBO-1; 04-29-2005)  
(Uniform State/USAID/Commerce/Agriculture/DIA)*

Representatives of the post, the Bureau of Overseas Buildings Operations (OBO), the Office of the Inspector General (OIG), and the Government Accountability Office (GAO), may make periodic inspections of U.S. Government-held properties and may make recommendations concerning management, operation, fire and life safety, and maintenance practices, as well as recommendations for new acquisition or construction projects. During routine post inspections, OBO area management officers should visit representative samples of U.S. Government-held properties, both offices and residences of the Department of State as well as other agencies. This policy does not apply to USAID.

### **15 FAM 152 POST RESPONSIBILITIES**

(Uniform State/USAID/Commerce/Agriculture/DIA)*

15 FAM 613 requires that post officials inspect U.S. Government-owned/long-term leased (GO/LTL) properties at least annually. Posts will make available, upon request, records relating to the properties and provide necessary support to these officials in the conduct of their assigned duties. OBO officers visiting posts should be advised of all problems associated with U.S. Government-held property.
