

PROTOCOL

**TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND
THE RUSSIAN FEDERATION CONCERNING THE SAFE AND SECURE
TRANSPORTATION, STORAGE AND DESTRUCTION OF WEAPONS AND THE
PREVENTION OF WEAPONS PROLIFERATION
OF JUNE 17, 1992**

The United States of America and the Russian Federation, hereinafter referred to as the Parties,

In accordance with Article XIV of the Agreement between the United States of America and the Russian Federation Concerning the Safe and Secure Transportation, Storage and Destruction of Weapons and the Prevention of Weapons Proliferation, signed at Washington on June 17, 1992, as amended and extended by the Protocol of June 15/16, 1999, and amended by the Agreement concluded by the exchange of notes of January 13 and February 3, 2005 (hereinafter the 1992 Agreement),

Have agreed as follows:

Article 1

The term of the 1992 Agreement shall be extended from June 17, 2006, for seven years.

Article 2

The provisions of the 1992 Agreement shall apply to the agreements listed in the annex to this Protocol, which is an integral part of this Protocol, and to their implementation.

Article 3

This Protocol shall be applied provisionally from the date of signature and shall enter into force on the date of the receipt of the last written notification that the Parties have completed the internal government procedures necessary for its entry into force.

of the Russian Federation Concerning the Safe, Secure and Ecologically Sound Destruction of Chemical Weapons of July 30, 1992, as amended March 18, 1994; May 28, 1996; April 10, 1997; December 29, 1997; January 14, 1999; November 14, 2000; August 29, 2002; October 28, 2002; March 17, 2003; March 18, 2003; September 23, 2003; July 28, 2004; and October 6, 2005.
