As of November 1, 2015, for reasons of public safety, the Office of Foreign Missions will increase the amount of points assessed on U.S. State Department driver's licenses for many driving infractions. Several infractions will rise to 12 demerit points leading, per long-standing Department policy, to automatic driving suspension for a single incident. See below for a list of these particular infractions. Please drive carefully and obey U.S. traffic laws. Driving in the United States is a privilege not a right.
