

Catchall Authorities in the North Korean and Iran UN Security Council Resolutions

DPRK UNSCRs

UNSCR 1718 (2006)

8(a)(ii) & 8(c). Prohibited WMD Items List: Prohibits the transfer to/from the DPRK of lists of specific items associated with WMD and their delivery systems (S/2006/814, S/2006/815, and S/2006/853). [NOTE: S/2006/853 supersedes S/2006/816, which is cited in the resolution.]

8(a)(i) & 8(b). Conventional Catch-all: Prohibits the direct or indirect supply, sale, or transfer to/from the DPRK of seven categories of arms and “*related material, including spare parts, or items as determined by the Security Council or the [1718 Committee]*” [NOTE: Neither the UNSC or the Committee has made such a determination.]

8(a)(ii) & 8(b). WMD Catch-all: Prohibits the direct or indirect supply, sale, or transfer to/from the DPRK of “*other items, materials, equipment, goods, and technology, determined by the Security Council or the Committee, which could contribute to DPRK’s nuclear-related ballistic missile-related, or other weapons of mass destruction related programmes.*”

8(c). Conventional and WMD Catch-all: Prohibits transfers to/from the DPRK, and including those by DPRK nationals (regardless of the physical origins of the transfer) or from DPRK territory, of “*technical training, advice, services or assistance related to the provision, manufacture, maintenance, or use of*” listed conventional and WMD items/systems/programs.

UNSCR 1874 (2009)

10. Conventional Catch-all: Prohibits transfers to/from the DPRK of all “*arms and related materiel,*” and “*financial transactions, technical training, advice, services or assistance related to the provision, manufacture, maintenance or use of such arms,* except for the import of small arms and light weapons and their related materiel.”

Iran UNSCRs

UNSCR 1737 (2006)

3 & 4. Prohibited WMD Items List: Prohibits the transfer to/from Iran of lists of specific items associated with WMD and their delivery systems. [NOTE: The lists of prohibited items were subsequently updated by UNSCR 1803 O.P. 8 and UNSCR 1929 O.P. 13, and now include items listed on INFCIRC/254/Rev 9 Part 1, INRCIRC/254/Rev. 7 Part 2, and S/2010/263.]

4. WMD Catch-all: Requires states to take the necessary measures to prevent listed WMD-related items from being sold, supplied, or transferred to Iran and “*any other [unlisted] items*” if the State determines they “*would contribute to enrichment-related, reprocessing or heavy-water related activities or to the development of nuclear weapon delivery systems*” and “*any other [unlisted] items if the State determines they would contribute to the pursuit of activities related to other topics about which the IAEA has expressed concerns or has identified as outstanding.*”

6. WMD Catch-all: Requires countries to take the necessary measures to prevent provision to Iran of “*technical assistance or training, financial assistance, investment, brokering or other services, and the transfer of financial resources or services, related to the supply, sale, transfer, manufacture, or use*” of items prohibited by 1737 O.P. 3 (listed items) and 4 (catch-all items).

UNSCR 1747 (2007)

5. Conventional Catch-all: Prohibits the supply, sale, or transfer by Iran of “*arms or related materiel,*” and obligates states to prohibit the procurement of such items from Iran by their nationals, or using their flag vessels or aircraft, and whether or not originating in the territory of Iran.

UNSCR 1929 (2010)

8. Conventional Catch-all: Prohibits the direct or indirect supply, sale, or transfer to Iran of seven categories of arms and “*related material, including spare parts*” or items as determined by the Security Council or the [1737 Committee]” and “*technical training, financial resources or services, advice, other services or assistance related to the supply, sale, transfer, provision, manufacture, maintenance, or use of such arms and related materiel*” and to exercise vigilance

and restraint in transfers of “*all other arms and related materiel*” [NOTE: Neither the UNSC or the Committee has made such a determination.]

9. Missile Catch-all: Requires states to take all necessary measures to prevent the transfer of “*technology or technical assistance to Iran related to...ballistic missiles capable of delivering nuclear weapons.*”

13. WMD Catch-all: Prohibits the transfer to Iran of listed items and “*any further items if the State determines that they could contribute to enrichment-related, reprocessing or heavy-water related activities or to the development of nuclear weapon delivery systems.*”
