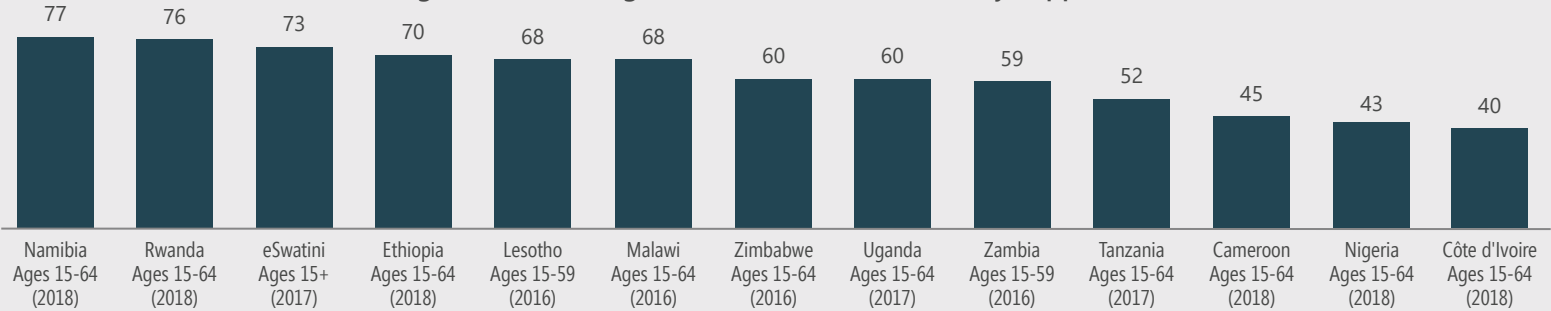

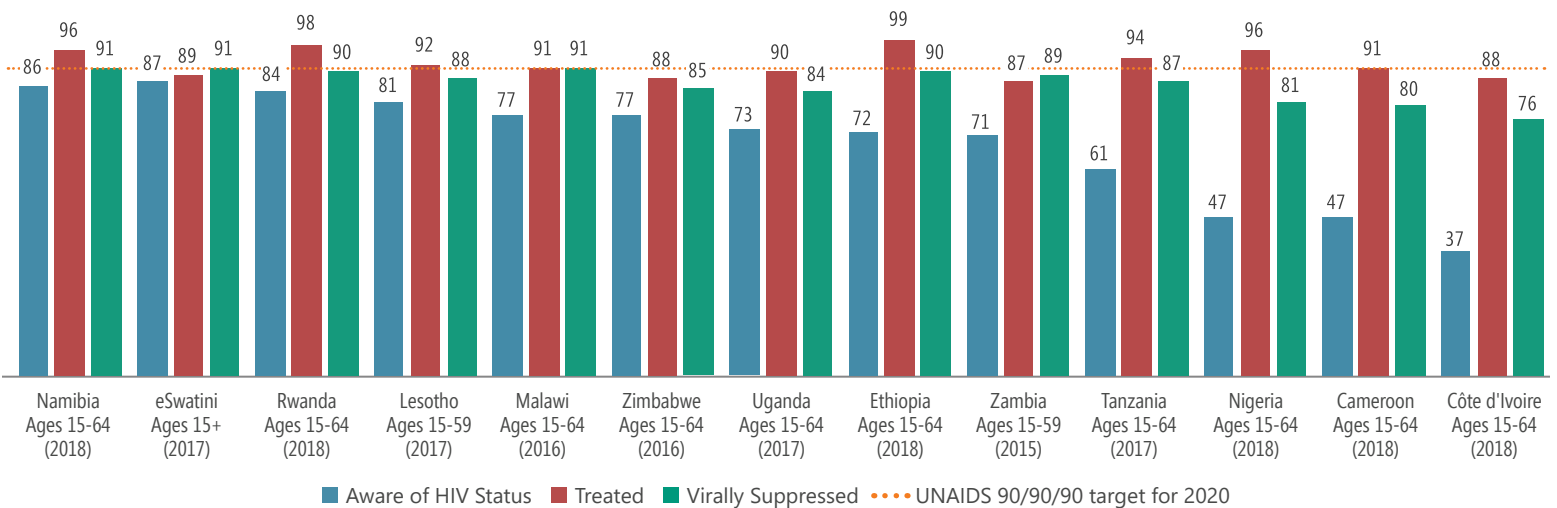
Figure 1 – Percentage of HIV-Positive Adults Virally Suppressed



PEPFAR remains a global leader in using granular data to drive health care results and increase impact. This includes through our pioneering use of large national household surveys to track progress and identify key gaps toward high-burden countries reaching HIV/AIDS epidemic control while triangulating survey findings with our program data.

PEPFAR Population-Based Household Survey Results show that several African countries are making significant progress toward controlling their HIV/AIDS epidemic, including by having either approached or exceeded the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) 90-90-90 targets for the end of 2020. These countries have translated resources from PEPFAR and the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria into highly impactful programs that transcend poverty and weak health systems to reach clients with critical HIV prevention and treatment services.

These national survey results also reinforce that achieving HIV/AIDS epidemic control requires not only financial investment but also effective collaboration and mutual accountability between partner governments and communities. The surveys also demonstrate the critical role of a supportive policy environment in partner countries to drive progress, including through the rapid adoption and full implementation at scale of relevant World Health Organization policies. These data make clear that providing client-centered HIV prevention and treatment services is essential to address key barriers to health care access, particularly for populations that are often missed, including the most vulnerable and poor.
