

## Mozambique Responsibility Matrix 2019

The Responsibility Matrix was a new addition to the SID process in 2019. To complete the tool the Mozambique PEPFAR Coordination Office and UNAIDS coordinated a meeting with the following: leadership from the PEPFAR interagency team, the Global Fund (the Fund Portfolio Manager was on mission in Mozambique), UNAIDS, and the host country government (Ministry of Health and National AIDS Council).

There was consensus on the following points as a result of completing the Responsibility Matrix:

- Final responsibility for all aspects of the program rests with the Government
- Both PEPFAR and the Global Fund are critical partners whose support is essential
- PEPFAR's support is in all aspects of service delivery as well as above-site services, where most of Global Fund's support is in above-site areas (non-service delivery assistance)
- Strategy Formulation and Planning is an area where the Government works very closely with PEPFAR, and at times also with the Global Fund, in specific technical areas.
- Coordination among all of the main stakeholders is very critical

The group completing the Responsibility Matrix did comment that some questions were not clear and therefore the tool was completed as best as possible. The following areas were unclear: Health Workforce and Program Implementation, Management, and Support.
