The **American International School of Algiers (AISA)** is an independent, coeducational day school, which offers a challenging, supportive, student-centered program to students from kindergarten (applicants must be five years old by December 1) through grade 8. AISA has no provisions to offer additional ESL support. In addition, the school does not serve students with special educational needs.

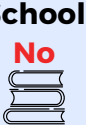

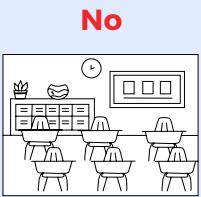
