The Walworth Barbour American International School in Israel (WBAIS) is a private, co-educational PK-12 institution offering an American college preparatory program leading to a U.S. high school diploma. The school currently enrolls 575 students, and is located in Even Yehuda, a residential district 20 kilometers north of Tel Aviv.
