The International School of Ulaanbaatar (ISU) is a nonprofit, independent, coeducational day school offering an educational program from pre-kindergarten through grade 12 for students of all nationalities. Permission to run the school was granted by the Mongolian Ministry of Education in May 1992. The school year is divided into two semesters that run from August to June.
