The [American Embassy School](#), New Delhi offers an American standards-based curriculum with an international perspective for pre-kindergarten through grade 12. Students may opt for the two-year International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IBDP) in grades 11 and 12. The school year consists of two semesters: early August to mid-December and early January to the end of May. Currently, we have more than 60 nationalities enrolled at AES.
