## The U.S. Government (USG) GHS Program in Georgia

The U.S. partners with the Government of Georgia to strengthen capacities to prevent, detect, and respond to infectious disease threats. Areas of collaboration include strengthening antimicrobial resistance prevention, zoonotic disease detection and response, biosafety and biosecurity, national laboratory systems, disease surveillance, human resources, infection prevention and control, and health emergency management.

U.S. investments support and build on those made by the Government of Georgia, in coordination with other partners and stakeholders. Current and planned GHS activities reflect national priorities, utilize the best available data, and align with the country context and the health system.
