## The U.S. Government (USG) GHS Program in Kazakhstan

The U.S. partners with the Government of Kazakhstan to strengthen capacities to prevent, detect, and respond to infectious disease threats. Areas of collaboration include strengthening legal instruments, International Health Regulations (IHR) coordination, antimicrobial resistance prevention, zoonotic disease detection and response, national laboratory systems, disease surveillance, human resources, health emergency management, infection prevention and control, and risk communication and community engagement.

U.S. investments support and build on those made by the Government of Kazakhstan, in coordination with other partners and stakeholders. Current and planned GHS activities reflect national priorities, utilize the best available data, and align with the country context and the health system.
