The U.S. Government (USG) GHS Program in the Kyrgyz Republic

The U.S. partners with the Government of the Kyrgyz Republic to strengthen capacities to prevent, detect, and respond to disease public health threats. Areas of collaboration include strengthening the antimicrobial resistance action plan, promoting multisectoral zoonotic disease programming, strengthening national laboratory systems, improving disease surveillance, assessing and filling human resource needs, expanding health emergency management, strengthening risk communication and community engagement, and a One Health approach to global health security.

U.S. investments support and build on those made by the Government of the Kyrgyz Republic, in coordination with other multilateral, governmental, and non-governmental partners and stakeholders. Current and planned GHS activities reflect national and sub-national priorities, utilize evidence-based decision making, and align with the country context and the health system.
