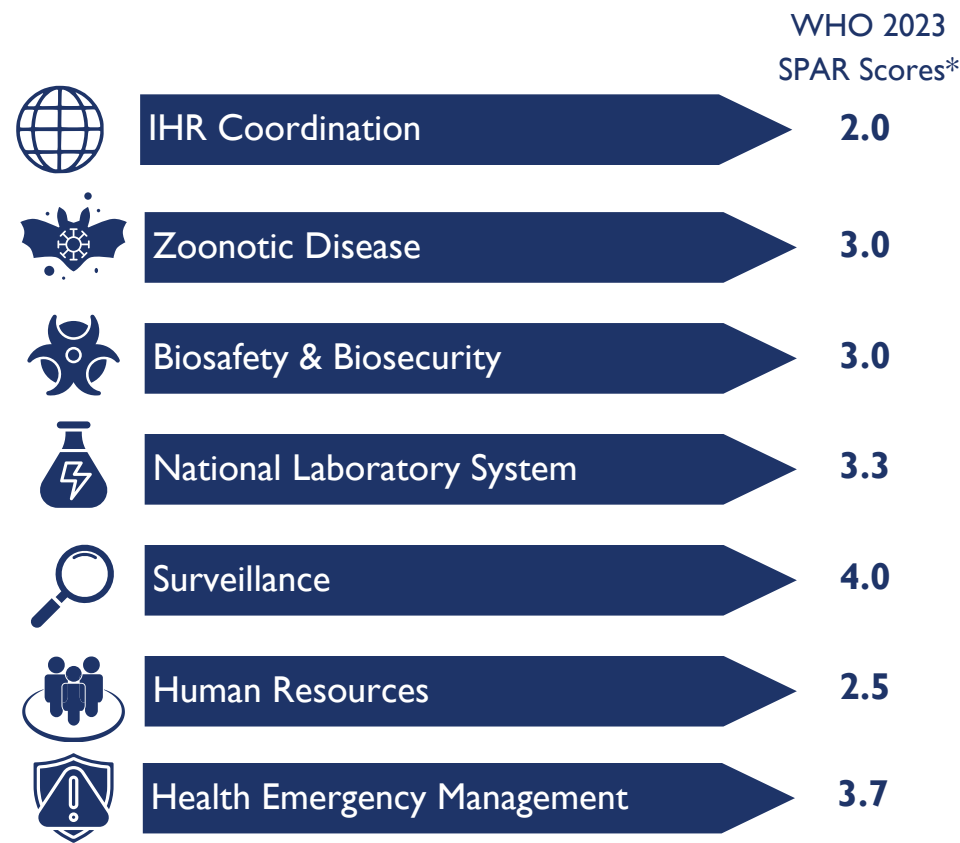

Technical Areas Endorsed by the Government of Malawi for U.S. Global Health Security Investments



* The World Health Organization (WHO) States Parties Annual Report (SPAR) is a publicly available self-assessment by the government of its global health security capacities. Scores presented here are based on a 5-point scale. Biosafety & Biosecurity score presented separately from National Laboratory System score.

The U.S. Government (USG) GHS Program in Malawi

The U.S. partners with the Government of Malawi to strengthen capacities to prevent, detect, and respond to infectious disease threats. Areas of collaboration include strengthening International Health Regulations (IHR) coordination, zoonotic disease detection and response, biosafety and biosecurity, national laboratory systems, disease surveillance, human resources, and health emergency management.

U.S. investments support and build on those made by the Government of Malawi, in coordination with other partners and stakeholders. Current and planned GHS activities reflect national priorities, utilize the best available data, and align with the country context and the health system.
