The U.S. Government (USG) GHS Program in Papua New Guinea

The U.S. partners with the Government of Papua New Guinea to strengthen capacities to prevent, detect, and respond to infectious disease threats. Areas of collaboration include strengthening zoonotic disease detection and response, national laboratory systems, disease surveillance, and human resources

U.S. investments support and build on those made by the Government of Papua New Guinea, in coordination with other partners and stakeholders. Current and planned GHS activities reflect national priorities, utilize the best available data, and align with the country context and the health system.
